THE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OF GEORGIA

Thank you for your interest in dual enrollment and the University System of Georgia (USG)! With [26 colleges and universities](#) across the state, the USG offers many opportunities for high school students to enrich their high school experience and get a jump start on college. This resource is designed to help future dual enrollment students identify the colleges and universities that best fit their location and academic credentials.

SCHOOL ACCREDITATION

The USG requires enrollment in a public school regulated by a school system and state department of education or graduation from a high school or home school program accredited by or holding provisional accreditation from one of the following accrediting bodies:

Applicants who attend a homeschool or high school not accredited by one of the above must document their high school curriculum through the submission of a curriculum packet. The curriculum packet must include the course title, description, learning materials utilized (textbooks, software, reading lists, etc.), year the course was completed, course credits and grade earned, and the school, institution, or program through which the course was taken (homeschool program, private/public school, online program, postsecondary institution, etc.) for each academic unit. Institutions may require additional documentation and/or test scores to further assess subject matter competency and preparation for college-level coursework. Students should contact their institution of interest to learn more.

REQUIRED HIGH SCHOOL CURRICULUM

Dual enrollment applicants must be on-track for meeting their high school graduation requirements and completing the 17 units of the USG's Required High School Curriculum (RHSC). The RHSC consists of the following:

- ♦ 4 units of English
- ♦ 4 units of mathematics
- ♦ 4 units of science
- ♦ 3 units of social science
- ♦ 2 units of the same foreign language, 2 units of American Sign Language, or 2 units of computer science with an emphasis on programming/coding.

Additional information about the RHSC, including the approved courses for each RHSC area, can be found on the USG's [Staying on Course](#) document. Completion of the RHSC is required for freshman admission.

HIGH SCHOOL GRADE POINT AVERAGE

A minimum High School Grade Point Average (GPA) is required for dual enrollment admission. The GPA is based on the RHSC units completed at the time of admission and is calculated by converting an applicant’s numerical grades to letter grades based on the conversion table provided by their high school. The letter grades are converted to quality points as follows:

A = 4 B = 3 C = 2 D = 1 F = 0

The GPA required for dual enrollment admission to each institution is provided in this document.

TEST SCORE REQUIREMENTS

The USG colleges and universities may opt to require SAT, PSAT, ACT, PreACT, and/or Accuplacer scores for dual enrollment admission. Scores required for dual enrollment admission, if any, are provided in this document.

Students eligible to enroll in the 10th grade should be aware of the score requirements to participate in the Dual Enrollment Funding Program as a 10th grader attending a USG college or university. Please see the Dual Enrollment Program Funding section of this document for more information.

PARENT/GUARDIAN APPROVAL

Parent/guardian approval is required. The approval is obtained through the Dual Enrollment Program funding application for students eligible for funding. The student and parent/guardian portion of the funding application must be submitted prior to admission and the high school portion is required for registration. Students planning to enroll in course hours that are ineligible for funding must submit a [Self-Pay Course Approval Form](#) which includes a section for parent/guardian approval. Students enrolling in a mix of funded and unfunded hours must submit both a funding application and a Self-Pay Course Approval Form.

COURSE PREREQUISITES AND PLACEMENT

Students must work closely with their high school counselor and college advisor to ensure enrollment in appropriate courses.

Enrollment in any course is subject to availability and course prerequisites/corequisites must be met.

The following English & math placement requirements apply to students interested in taking English or math through dual enrollment and institutions may have additional or higher requirements. English and math courses successfully completed at another college or university may also satisfy placement requirements.

Dual enrollment students who have not successfully completed high school Algebra II/Advanced Algebra (or the equivalent) are not permitted to enroll in any college math course regardless of test scores or high school GPA.

Dual enrollment students intending to transfer within or to the USG after high school graduation are encouraged to explore how their credits may transfer using the [College Credit Transfer Tool](#) (GAFutures account required).

DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM FUNDING

Dual enrollment admission does not guarantee eligibility for funding and students who are eligible for funding may have some expenses. Students are encouraged to review the [GAfutures Dual Enrollment page](#) to learn more about the funding requirements and limits. Students in the 9th grade are not eligible for program funding. Students in the 10th grade must have a minimum SAT Total score of 1200 or a minimum ACT Composite score of 26 in a single national test administration to be eligible for funding while attending a USG institution. PSAT, Pre-ACT and Accuplacer scores cannot be used to qualify for 10th grade funding.

In accordance with O.C.G.A. 20-3-519, if applicable, male students must meet federal Selective Service registration requirements to be eligible for funding. Please visit the [GAfutures Dual Enrollment Eligibility page](#) for additional information on the selective service requirement.

Students planning to receive Dual Enrollment Program funding must submit a funding application through their [GAfutures account](#). The student and parent portion of the funding application must be submitted before the student is admitted. The high school section of the funding application is required for registration. Students must ensure a completed funding application is submitted by no later than the funding application deadline for each term in attendance to avoid possible tuition charges.

The [Dual Enrollment Course Directory](#) provides the courses eligible for Dual Enrollment Program funding. Students may be eligible to enroll in courses not listed on the Directory but are responsible for the cost of their textbooks, tuition, and fees charged by their institution.

Students planning to enroll in any course for which they will not be eligible for Dual Enrollment Program funding for any reason (enrollment in an ineligible course, enrollment in the 9th grade, enrollment in the 10th grade without the minimum SAT/ACT scores required for funding eligibility, enrollment after the funding cap has been met, etc.) must submit a [Self-Pay Course Approval Form](#). Students enrolling in funded and unfunded hours must submit both a funding application and a Self-Pay Course Approval Form.

In addition to the institution-specific requirements listed on the following pages, all dual enrollment applicants must provide the following:

- ☐ A transcript (and/or curriculum packet) showing the student is on-track for graduating high school and completing the USG's [Required High School Curriculum \(RHSC\)](#). See the Required High School Curriculum information on page 1 for additional details.
- ☐ Parent/guardian consent. The consent is obtained from the [GAfutures Dual Enrollment Funding Application](#) for those eligible for funding and from the [Self-Pay Course Approval Form](#) for those ineligible for funding.
