SCHOOL ACCREDITATION

The USG requires graduation from a public school regulated by a school system and state department of education or graduation from a high school or home school program accredited by or holding provisional accreditation from one of the following accrediting bodies:

Applicants who attend a homeschool or high school not accredited by one of the above must document their high school curriculum through the submission of a curriculum packet. The curriculum packet must include the course title, course description, learning materials utilized (textbooks, software, reading lists, etc.), year course was completed, course credits and grade earned, and the school, institution, or program through which the course was taken (homeschool program, private/public school, online program, postsecondary institution, etc.) for each academic unit. Institutions may require additional documentation and/or test scores to further assess subject matter competency and preparation for college-level coursework. Students attending a non-accredited homeschool or high school are encouraged to contact their institution of interest to learn more.

REQUIRED HIGH SCHOOL CURRICULUM

Applicants must complete the 17 academic units of the USG's Required High School Curriculum (RHSC). The RHSC consists of 4 units of English, 4 units of mathematics, 4 units of science, 3 units of social science, and 2 units of the same foreign language, 2 units of American Sign Language, or 2 units of computer science with an emphasis on programming/coding. The specific courses that satisfy the RHSC are provided on the USG's [Staying on Course](#) document.

HIGH SCHOOL GRADE POINT AVERAGE

A minimum High School Grade Point Average (HS GPA) is required and is based on the 17 RHSC units. High school numerical grades are converted to letter grades based on the conversion table provided by each high school and then converted to quality points as follows.

$$A = 4 \qquad B = 3 \qquad C = 2 \qquad D = 1 \qquad F = 0$$

The GPA is calculated by dividing the total quality points by the number of high school units.

SAT/ACT SCORE REQUIREMENTS

The USG continues to waive SAT/ACT score requirements at 23 of the 26 institutions for admission through Summer 2026. The temporary waiver does not apply to the Georgia Institute of Technology, the University of Georgia, or Georgia College & State University. Starting with admission for the Fall 2026 term, test scores are also required for admission to Augusta University, Georgia State University (Atlanta Campus only), Georgia Southern University (Statesboro and Armstrong Campuses only), and Kennesaw State University. Students applying to a university not requiring test scores may be admitted by meeting minimum test score, Freshman Index, and high school GPA requirements, or by meeting a higher high school GPA. This document provides the institution requirements to be admitted both with and without test scores for Fall 2026-Summer 2027.

FRESHMAN INDEX

The Freshman Index (FI) is calculated using an applicant's High School GPA and SAT or ACT scores. The following formulas are used to calculate FI:

SAT FI Formula: $500 \times (\text{HS GPA}) + 1.06 \times (\text{SAT ERW} + \text{Math}) - 74$

Example: A student with a 2.9 HSGPA & 480 ERW/440 Math would use the following calculation:

$$\text{SAT FI} = 500 \times (2.9) + 1.06 \times (480 + 440) - 74$$

$$\text{SAT FI} = 2351.2$$

ACT FI Formula: $500 \times (\text{HS GPA}) + (\text{ACT Composite} \times 42) + 88$

Example: A student with a 2.7 HSGPA & 18 Composite would use the following calculation:

$$\text{ACT FI} = 500 \times (2.7) + (18 \times 42) + 88$$

$$\text{ACT FI} = 2194$$

**Beginning in April 2025, as part of test enhancements made by the ACT, students may elect whether to take the ACT science test. With this change, the ACT Composite score calculation will no longer include the science section score. The USG will continue to accept the Composite score as reported by the ACT and the science test will not be required for the Freshman Index calculation.*

LEARNING SUPPORT PLACEMENT

Learning Support is a generic term for programs designed to assist students with collegiate work and are intended to serve students who need additional support in mathematics or English (reading/writing). The “default placement” for all students is in entry-level English and mathematics with corequisite Learning Support unless exemption criteria are met.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Eligibility for admission is determined after the college or university has completed a thorough review of an applicant's admission application and credentials. Meeting the minimums provided on this document does not guarantee admission.
